# Virtually ending violence is a legacy we embrace for future generations

The Community Violence Intervention Center is an organization focused on staying the course. For our team and many partners, that course is navigated through our Safer Tomorrows Road Map, a bold vision to virtually end violence in two generations. We concentrate on results, strategic intention and measurement because violence doesn't stop—for any challenge.

Behind the countless data-rich spreadsheets, however, are significant human beings who rely on us to bring our best selves to lead this work. Never has this been more apparent than the past six months as the pandemic has changed the way we interact with our clients, donors, volunteers and partners.

Throughout our past 40 years of service, which we officially honored on Aug. 19, CVIC has been fortunate to meet several tests with the unmatched collaboration of a community that cares about families. Because CVIC is never alone, our clients aren't either.

Thanks to your continued commitment to our community's future, we're making progress. Each year, nearly 3,000 clients receive safety and healing services, and over 15,000 receive education and training. With your help, we have reached several milestones throughout our four decades of service, including:

- 1980: Began service to our community as Adult Abuse Community Service
- 1990: Launched court and criminal justice advocacy services
- 2000: Opened a shelter, began child visits and career counseling, and expanded children's services, thanks to a \$1.95 million capital campaign
- 2017: Ignited the Safer Tomorrows Road Map, taking an earlier project to a new level and establishing a bold vision to virtually end violence in two generations; after a successful \$3.1 million capital campaign, opened Mary's Place Shelter
- 2019: Launched Green Dot, a nationally recognized bystander intervention program

These milestones represent families who rest easier each night and embrace hope for their tomorrows simply because you cared. For this and future generations, we extend to you our deepest gratitude.

# Tens of thousands served by CVIC

Over the past 40 years, we estimate that up to 70,000 adults and children received safety and healing services, and tens of thousands were educated and trained on healthy relationships and best practices through well over 7,000 presentations. (Note that we are unable to factor in duplication among years.) The timeline at right shows the expansion of services and collaboration over our 40 years, enhancing safety and building hope for local families.

# Holistic continuum of services offered

In the early years, CVIC was unable to provide much more than a Band-Aid—a protection order and a night at a safe house.

But today, we are there from the moment of a 911 call, working with police and families through the crisis, to the opposite end of the continuum as people find freedom from violence—offering shelter, legal services, court advocacy, career counseling, transitional housing, therapy, child visits and exchanges, and intervention for those using violence.



# COVID-19 affects everyone

But none as tragically as families trapped with violence

As the pandemic began to spread, the people we serve were trapped at home with the person responsible for their injuries, fear and trauma. They had no way to safely call our crisis line to develop an escape plan, no respite from the toxic stress by going to school or work.

Add to that the financial crisis of losing their job, the pressure of home schooling their children, the surge in gun sales, and a community-wide reduction in desperately needed services, they were at greater risk than ever.

Many went even deeper into poverty. The situation continues to be dire for many families living without basic needs, while at the same time, experiencing severe violence and trauma.

- One woman went without food for two days, sleeping in entry ways of buildings because she wasn't safe at her apartment.
- The abusive partner of another woman tried to run her off the road—while her child was in the vehicle.
- Two young children were sexually assaulted by a new childcare provider, hired so their parent could be employed as an essential worker.

# CVIC MOBILIZES TO ENSURE **CONTINUAL SERVICES**

- Telehealth advocacy and therapy and online support groups
  - *Telehealth for youth and adults to provide support* and healing, with equipment (tablets and phones) in the hands of clients within two weeks; online support groups for adults harmed by violence
- Contact-free emergency food and supplies to clients in need

*Groceries, paper products, gift cards and therapy* kits with essential oils and coping strategies to help clients through this difficult time

- Shelter open with capacity
  - Practicing social distancing to meet health guidelines while ensuring safety and support
- Virtual supervised visits of children at risk
- Group intervention by video for adults using violence at home
- Online healthy relationship education Provided to students at home while school was in session

# CRISIS, SHELTER & STABILITY

"Thank all you angels so much for the help and blessings in this time of stress and tragedy in my life." – CVIC client

We helped 905 adults through the crisis of violence in 2019, working closely with law enforcement to ensure those at high risk of lethality were immediately linked to services. Over the past four years, 544 were screened as high risk, and 200 received services for the very first time.

We sheltered 121 adults and children, with families staying 52% more nights as they struggled to find housing they could afford. In the first half of 2020, families stayed even longer: a 46% increase in nights over the same period last year. We worked hard to help them find housing they could afford, with 5 families currently living in our transitional housing.

# SAFE CHILD VISITS

For kids who aren't safe when visiting a parent, we offered protection, providing 2,023 visits and exchanges for 595 adults and children in 2019. Parents also were safe when exchanging children with an abusive ex-partner.

# ADVOCACY WITHIN THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM

After suffering the devastation of crime, a record 1,193 people were served in 2019; 1,171 were provided case information and advocacy when offenders were prosecuted and their case entered the court system.

 97% of those surveyed said they were kept well-informed about their case

# **ENDING VIOLENCE**


"At first, I didn't want to be there, but then a lot of it started hitting home. I realized what I was doing wrong." – CVIC client

A record 237 adults were served, with 86 successfully completing our program that helps adults end their violence at home: an increase of 85% over 2018.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE COURT: We worked closely with the court, which heard 562 cases in 2019, to hold clients accountable to court orders for domestic violence programming.

- 74% drop in 911 calls to the homes of men completing our program\*
- 86% drop in protection orders placed on men completing our program\*

\* within 2 years of completing the program between 2004 and 2019

An alarming 40% of youth we serve have such high levels of trauma that they are at great risk of developing addictions, failing at school, and committing suicide. Our goal is to reach all 1,700 youth in our county who are estimated to be experiencing significant trauma, providing them evidence-based therapies to help them heal. In 2019, we provided therapy, advocacy and support to 227 children; 50 received 682 sessions of individual and/or group therapy.

- 97% of youth surveyed over 5 years learned healthy coping skills and improved emotional well-being
- 92% of youth surveyed reported feeling more hopeful about the future



# LOUIE CERTIFIED AS A THERAPY DOG!

We are happy to share that Louie has received his certification to practice therapy, and our kids love him. They say things like, "Louie doesn't judge me," and "Louie doesn't care if I got in trouble. He always looks at me the same."

# **ADULT THERAPY**

# COMMUNITY EDUCATION & PROFESSIONAL TRAINING

- 7,990 youth received education on dating abuse red flags, healthy friendships, bullying and respectful relationships
- 5,935 adults received education on violence, trauma and ways to help
- 1,441 professionals were trained on a coordinated and trauma-informed response to violence and related topics to promote the use of best practices
- 74% of male athletes surveyed in our Coaching Boys Into Men program are likely to stop a peer from physically abusing a female
- 10% decrease in students reporting they have experienced dating violence

Thanks to our partnership with **Gate City Bank** and **Altru Health System**, we launched the Green Dot bystander intervention program to empower community members to engage in healthy relationships. We sponsored trainings, presented at a regional health conference, developed a website (greendotggf.com) and held community-wide events.

Coaching Boys Into Men is an evidence-based program that trains coaches to mentor male high school athletes about respecting girls and women.

A companion program, Athletes As Leaders, trains coaches to mentor female high school athletes to take an active role in promoting healthy relationships.





# SAFETY: 65%

Shelter, 24-hour crisis intervention, collaboration with law enforcement and emergency room, transitional housing, career counseling, legal services, advocacy within the criminal justice system, notification about court cases, supervised child visitation and exchange, and intervention for adults who have been violent within their intimate partner relationships to end violence.

# HEALING: 14%

Evidence-based individual and group therapy for children and adults, art therapy, and animal-assisted therapy at CVIC and 16 area schools to increase access to services.

### PREVENTION EDUCATION: 21%

Evidence-based violence prevention and healthy relationship education for children at 15 schools and high school sports teams in Grand Forks County, professional training, Green Dot bystander intervention and other education for adults, and collaboration through major multi-agency projects.
