"Every survivor's journey is unique, and leaving an abusive relationship is a difficult and potentially dangerous process that requires time, sensitivity, support and resources. "Our holistic support includes safety planning, emergency shelter placement, legal advocacy, and other wraparound services that can help survivors protect themselves and their children as they move forward toward a healthier future."

<u>"Trauma may happen in a single moment, but the emotional scars left by interpersonal violence may still haunt those who experienced it and their loved ones long after the event occurred.</u> For children, that traumatic stress can interrupt a child's growth and development, which is why CVIC's evidence-based therapies help adults and youth who are healing from trauma." said Emily, director of youth therapy services. "For children, age-appropriate, play-based therapeutic interventions help them express their feelings, share their stories, and recover a sense of safety."

"In 2016, CVIC and its partners began a comprehensive, research-based initiative to end violence in two generations. As part of our education & prevention pillar, CVIC addresses domestic, dating and sexual violence, and bullying by promoting cultural change through education across a child's school lifecycle. At the same time, it also aims to prevent the effects of trauma from being passed among generations," said Brittany, director of prevention & education.
