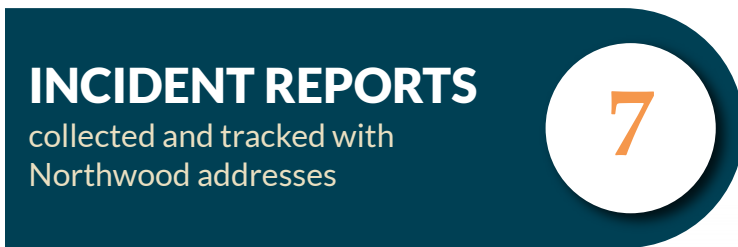
PROMOTING A SAFER COMMUNITY

CVIC sent **Chief Pollert** to Chicago, IL, to attend the Ending Violence Against Women International Annual Conference. CVIC covered registration fees, airfare, hotel, ground transportation and per diem.

Notification of Criminal Justice Events, Criminal Justice Advocacy/Court Accompaniment, Info on Victims' Rights & Notification, Info on the Criminal Justice System, Prosecution Interview Advocacy/Accompaniment, Individual Advocacy, Victim Impact Statement Assistance



SUPPLIES PROVIDED:

In 2022, CVIC purchased an Illumacam and supplies (roughly **\$3,000**) for rural police departments to access. This camera is used to collect forensic evidence from victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. **Chief Pollert** received training on the use of the camera.
